



## The Certificate of Higher Education in Licensing Law and Practice

## Course aims

- to enable students to acquire substantive knowledge and understanding of the legal principles and their application within the field of licensing law;
- to promote practical skills of identifying and processing information, and identifying, formulating and solving problems;
- to develop the personal competencies required in the practice of licensing law administration or other related careers and activities.

The course seeks to provide both an intellectual and practical experience for those involved, or wishing to seek employment, in the area of licensing law and administration. It has been developed in consultation with both the Institute of Licensing and local authorities, and draws upon the expertise of academics and practitioners in the field.

There are three awards:

1. Certificate of Higher Education in Licensing Law and Practice (120 credits)
2. Diploma in Licensing Law and Practice (90 credits)
3. Diploma of Special Study in Licensing Law and Practice (30 credits)

Successful completion of the Certificate fulfils membership criteria of the Institute of Licensing (subject to payment of membership fee).

## Course structure and modules

The Certificate is offered as a two year part-time course.

There are four core modules:

- Foundations of Legal Study (15 credits)
- Introduction to Licensing Law (15 credits)
- Licensing Law: Theory and Practice (30 credits)
- Project (30 credits)

There are a number of optional modules, of which two must be taken. These currently include:

- Managing the Evening and NightTime Economy (15 credits)
- Judicial Review (15 credits)
- Work placement (15 credits)
